Airtime Respiratory Patient Group

Airtime is a patient led initiative in Dudley for people with COPD and/or respiratory disorders.

It is a totally **FREE** group, which supports patients both mentally and physically via for example reducing the isolation they may feel through their illnesses; and by encouraging peer to peer support.

“Attending Airtime can help reduce feelings of social isolation as well as help to improve a person’s health and their ability to manage their condition”

Airtime is part of ‘Making Waves’ which is a collaborative effort through The Health Foundation and Coventry University. We are hoping to establish further funding for 17/18, as so far, the benefits of such projects have been incredibly positive!

The group is a lively, friendly bunch and up for anything! So far we've had tai chi, singing and laughter therapy, art workshops, African drumming and a pub lunch to name but a few of the activities carried out. There is always something different and exciting for participants to try out, although, equally, there is no pressure for those who feel it is too much etc. Alongside the 'fun stuff' we also hold informative talks which highlight the many issues faced by our group members; diet, medication and mental health etc.

We provide a buffet lunch each week and are able to cater for food intolerances too.

Travel can be reimbursed if proving too costly.

If you know anyone who may be interested in coming along, they are most welcome.

They may want to come with a relative or friend initially if nervous, and we can then encourage them to attend on a regular basis.

Dudley Falls Prevention



A new integrated falls one stop shop has launched. Dudley Falls Prevention is a service made up of Dudley Council's adult social care team, Dudley Clinical Commissioning Group and The Dudley Group NHS Foundation Trust all working together. It is for any adult aged 18 plus who is worried about falling. Whether they are concerned about their balance and stability and want to avoid falling, or have already taken a fall. People can refer themselves, or can be referred by their GP, nurse or the hospital.

Each person will receive a tailored programme of support to meet their needs from a multi-disciplinary team of experts and clinicians.

NHS Dudley CCG have commissioned Ross Care, in partnership with Blatchford to provide the specialist seating and Wheelchair service. This will include the Clinical Assessment & Repairs for service users in Dudley. This service, as of the 1st of April, will no longer be provided by Serco.
